Activities

Mid-term conference

Along with the University of Perugia, the Italian Sociological Association and our sister network in the ISA (TG04), we planned a mid-term conference which was initially due to take place in October 2020. The pandemic situation in Spring 2020 led us to postpone the conference by a year and indeed the conference finally took place entirely online from 18th to 20th October 2021. The excellent organizational work of our colleague Fabio D'Andrea led to a smooth and well run even, the costs of which were covered by sources available at the University of Perugia – hence there were no costs to network. 11 sessions including 3 keynotes and a Decolonising Risk Sociology roundtable towards the end of the conference, which was run in English and Spanish with translation.

60 participants, who each received a certificate of attendance, and more than 200 spectators for the streamed sessions.

As a prelude to the conference, Fabio had also organised a live-streamed Roundtable *Multi-dimensional risks* which formed part of the Festival della Sociologia, Narni, Italy, 16 October 2020. This latter event was run by the Italian Sociological Association and University of Perugia.

RN22 Activities at the main ESA Barcelona Conference

At the main ESA conference we ran 10 online sessions with 32 papers. These numbers were somewhat lower than in Manchester though the quality of papers and presentations was noticeably higher. We also coordinated far more joint sessions with other networks than we had done before and again, this led to high quality and very engaging sessions. This involved a further 31 more papers across 9 joint sessions – including 3 joint sessions with RN13 (Families and intimate lives) and 2 each with RN01 (Ageing in Europe), RN12 (Environment and Society), and RN16 (Sociology of Heath and Medicine). Discussions are taking place regarding the turning of some of these joint sessions into journal special issues.

PhD Workshop

RN22 had planned to run a PhD workshop in Barcelona which would have followed on from the main ESA conference. Planning for this was made uncertain by the pandemic and the eventual shift in the plans for the main conference. We then looked into possibilities of running the workshop later in October in Amsterdam and we were planning on using ESA funds to help different PhDs attend the conference. However, eventually, a combination of the family situations and other commitments of the PhDs (and thus some late withdrawals) and the wider uncertainty led us to hold the workshop online. We had 3 PhDs in the end (1 each from India, the Netherlands and Sweden), and due to the small numbers we were able to devote much time to written chapters by each of them. The workshop was led by Anna Olofsson, Maria Grazia Galantino and Patrick Brown, with excellent input and organisational input from Veronica Moretti, our board member focused on PhDs and ECRs. Alongside three lectures on risk theory (one tailored to the interests of each of the PhDs) and in depth feedback sessions, we also held a session on getting published as a PhD/ECR.

Newsletter

We continue to publish a quarterly newsletter which we publish in cooperation with our sister network in the ISA (TG04). In this past term we have shifted the email onto the Mail Chimp platform

which has made for more creative and mobile phone friendly layout, more pictures and also enables us to track which items attract most interests. A big thank you to Maria Grazia Galantino, Bert de Graaff and Patrick Brown for their work on the newsletter. Due to Covid-19 working pressures and fewer events, the number of issue reduced from 4 to 3 per year but we hope to return to normal soon.
